To help our day run smoothly, we ask parents to assist us in the following:

1. For the safety of our children, please do not park in the school parking lot before 3:00 pm. The playground is often in use until that time.

3. Please drive slowly and cautiously at all times in the school parking lot. Remember that the children use it as a playground during the day and may forget that after school it becomes a parking lot of moving vehicles. As adults, we must be extra careful.

Complaints/Concerns

If at any time during the school year you have a concern or complaint about something in the school, please bring it to the attention of the proper person in the school. Questions or concerns about a teacher's procedures, a child's homework or grades, or anything happening in an individual classroom should be addressed to the teacher. If the question or concern is about something in school in general, or if you are not sure with whom you should speak, then contact Mrs. Kretschmar. We want to know when you have a concern, and if possible, address it.

Parents FYI

** We are still collecting **used ink cartridges, General Mills boxtops, Coke product codes, and Kwik Trip milk caps.**

** The statement for each family's account will be emailed or mailed monthly. This will include hot lunch/milk, child care, band, uniform user fee, etc. throughout the year. You may also check your balance in the school office at any time. Please make timely payments.

Illness

If your child is ill please do not send them to school. Sick students should stay out of school for 24 hours after fever is gone without the use of Tylenol or Ibuprofen and other symptoms are no longer present.



Children who are ill upon arrival at school or become ill during the school day will be sent home. Contact the school as early as possible, and notify us of all symptoms your child has. (You may call before 8:00 and leave a message on the answering machine.) Asking a brother or sister to tell the teacher that the child is sick is not acceptable.
